Commander's Corner

This fall semester will be one of the most important and consequential periods of time for the Company in some time. We have been reinstated as a Club at Fordham University and how we act now will affect our future members and the reputation of D-8 exceptionally more than usual for years to come. Failure to reform and perform honorably will not simply hurt a University Club, but may also destroy the lives of soldiers that our members will lead one day on the battlefield. It is this tremendous duty we assume and our prospects for fulfilling it that I will address in this newsletter. It is easy to become discouraged when faced with the heavy responsibility or the recent events we have encountered, but I assure you our prospects are strong.

The first reason for confidence is the quality of our members. Every organization's strength comes from the strength of its people and our people are some of the strongest individuals that the Company has had in some time. I promise you also that this is not only my opinion but that of the Fordham Army ROTC Cadre, as well. Three of our current seniors attended Army ROTC's advanced camp this past summer and all three were ranked within the top thirty-five percent of their training Companies, two of which finished in the top fifteen percent. One of our Marine-option Cadets completed Marine Corps OCS in July and he, in addition to being in the top of his Navy ROTC program, graduated in the top of his class there. He also won a highly competitive Marine aviation contract. Our other Marine Cadet recently received a highly coveted and rare Marine-option ROTC scholarship after transferring from regular Navy ROTC. In Fordham Army ROTC, two of the

four top Cadet Battalion level leadership positions to which a cadet can be assigned are held by D-8 members, despite the fact that D-8 members make up less than twenty percent of each class. This praise is not to say that we are perfect by any measure or do not require change as an organization. Our goal is to have all our Cadets finish in the top fifteen percent at the military schools they attend and to have all top leadership positions in ROTC filled by our members. This all is to say that we have a solid foundation for the road ahead and one can feel optimistic about our future.

The next reason to feel secure is our renewed and reinvigorated partnership with the Fordham Army ROTC Cadre and University Administration. Both are excited for our return and invested in our success. Among the Cadre members who have volunteered to assist us is half a century of leadership and military experience. This is not to mention the nearly limitless source of information and experience we can draw from our Alumni. These Cadre will be present at a majority of our events, assist us in our development, and advise us on our planning and procedures. With ROTC Cadre and the Alumni as our safety net for quality, we will not fail.

A barrier to optimism for our prospects is the feeling that D-8 will lose its character and difficult training as a result of University and Cadre stipulations and oversight. I could emphasize how the new PMS at Fordham is a product of the Ranger Regiment and has demanding standards for us, that the restrictions the University has imposed place no obstacles to difficult training, or that we will continue to do our most daunting events. I could also emphasize how those Cadre who observe us are in a purely advisory role and we still determine our own training and actions. However, I believe it is best to share with you

a paragraph written by my XO, Brock Trexler, which expresses a sentiment shared by the Army ROTC Cadre and I think strongly conveys the attitudes of the Company.

On Wednesday August 24, three alumni (Charlie Tagliareni, Greg D'Arbonne, and Phil Crotty) met with the Fordham University Provost and his Chief-of-Staff to urge Fordham to establish the office of Director of Military and University Affairs. He was not listed on the formal program, but those who knew him could not imagine that he would pass up on the opportunity to be present at A-8's formal re-induction into Pershing Rifles. As always, he gave a great speech filled with humor and life's lessons recounting his upbringing in the South Bronx and the positive effects P/Rs had on his life and career. Particularly touching was when Colin called up to the stage Cadet Arthur Zych (current A-8 P/R commander) and presented him with his personal P/R memorabilia: specifically, his P/R mug, P/R ring, P/R Captain's shield he wore when he commanded A-B (with the hope that the new CO would pass it down to future A-8 commanders), and lastly his P/R cord. It was a wonderful, heartfelt gesture in bridging the 'old A-B' with the 'rising phoenix'."

Sadly, Susan Hildner, devoted wife of COL Bob Hildner USAF (Ret.) CO of D-8 '58-'59 and mother of BG Terrence Hildner, USA passed away on Aug. 14, 2016 due to a fatal auto collision in La Plata, MD. Her oldest son, BG Terrence Hildner, died in Afghanistan in 2012 and Bob passed away a little over a year ago after back surgery. Please remember them all in your prayers. HILDNER SUSAN MARIE HILDNER (Age 75) Susan Marie (Green) Hildner, of Port Tobacco, MD, devoted wife, mother, and grandmother, died on August 14, 2016, as a result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident. Susan was born and raised in Queens, NY where she met her future husband, Robert Hildner, a graduate of Fordham University. Susan dedicated the first 20 years of her marriage to raising her family as a supportive Air Force spouse, living in postings around the world and the US, most recently in Northern VA. Susan obtained her undergraduate and Master"s degrees in Public Administration at Auburn University in 1980 and subsequently began work in the Department of Defense as a Contract Specialist intern at the Naval Air Systems Command in Arlington, VA where she progressed to become the Lead Contracting Officer. She then moved to the Pentagon where she ultimately earned a senior position in Program Acquisition and International Contracting. Susan was selected as a member of the Senior Executive Service in 2007 as Deputy Director, Contract Policy and International Contracting. Susan was awarded the Secretary of Defense Medal for Exceptional Civilian Service, the Department of the Navy Meritorious Civilian Service Award, and two Navy Special Act Awards. When she retired in May 2014, Susan had been in Federal Service for 34 years. Susan loved to

paint, sew, and garden. She was beloved by many the successful cooperation and contribution to because of her generous heart and loving personality. Susan is survived by one son, Steven Hildner of Fairfax, a daughter Elizabeth Edwards of Port Tobacco, five grandchildren and four great grandchildren. She is predeceased by her husband Colonel Robert E. Hildner, USAF, and son Brigadier General Terence John Hildner, US Army. Friends received on Thursday, August 25, 2016 from 5-8PM with a Prayer Service at 7PM at Raymond Funeral Service (La Plata, MD). Mass of Christian Burial will be held on August 26, 2016 at 10:30 a.m. at Sacred Heart Church, La Plata, MD.
